

## How much should I expect to pay for SOLIQUA 100/33?

Many patients have questions when it comes to the cost and insurance coverage of SOLIQUA 100/33.

Below is some key information that could be helpful.

The price of prescription drugs can sometimes seem complicated, but keep in mind that the price you pay depends on a number of things:

- Whether you have prescription drug insurance
- The type of insurance you have
- Whether your insurance provider considers the medication to be preferred or not preferred
- Whether you've met your deductible
- The pharmacy you use to fill your prescriptions

### What Is a List Price?

All prescription medications have a list price, but very few patients pay the list price, which is a price set by the manufacturer. The list price of SOLIQUA 100/33 is \$808.05 USD per pack, but most people will not pay the list price.<sup>a</sup>

A monthly supply of SOLIQUA 100/33 is considered to be 2 packs per month.

## COMMERCIAL/EMPLOYER PROVIDED INSURANCE

On average, 80% of patients, or 8 out of 10, will pay between \$0–\$20 per month for a prescription of SOLIQUA 100/33. The remaining 20% will pay an average of \$51 per month. Your actual cost or co-pay depends on your insurance plan's drug coverage. Each plan is different and determines your out-of-pocket cost.<sup>b</sup>

### The SOLIQUA 100/33 Savings Card

If you have commercial prescription insurance, you may be eligible to save on SOLIQUA 100/33: Your co-pay may be as little as \$9\* for a 30-day supply, with a maximum savings of \$365 per pack, up to 2 packs for each 30-day supply, for the duration of the program. ## MEDICARE PART D COVERAGE INFORMATION

The average out-of-pocket cost for Medicare Part D patients in 2022 was \$39 per month.<sup>b</sup>

9 out of 10 of Medicare Part D patients are covered for SOLIQUA 100/33.

Beginning in 2023, SOLIQUA 100/33 is included under the Inflation Reduction Act (Medicare Part D Insulin Savings), which provides insulin savings, capping monthly cost at \$35 for Seniors who have Medicare Part D. This ensures a predictable, stable copay, regardless of phase including the donut hole.

This cap goes into effect January 1, 2023 and extends to all Part D plans that cover SOLIQUA 100/33.

Unlike its predecessor, Medicare Part D Senior Savings Model, as a patient, you will automatically have access to these savings and will no longer need to enroll in a participating program or plan.

If you are eligible for Extra Help Medicare program, you will pay no more than \$10.35 for a monthly supply of SOLIQUA 100/33.

## MEDICAID INFORMATION

The average out-of-pocket cost for Medicaid patients in 2022 was \$2 per month.<sup>b</sup>

## NO INSURANCE COVERAGE

What do most people who are uninsured pay?

If you do not have insurance that covers your prescription medications, or if your insurance does not cover SOLIQUA 100/33 you can typically expect to pay the list price shown above plus any additional pharmacy charges. The price you pay varies from pharmacy to pharmacy. However, eligible cash-paying patients and patients who have commercial insurance, but do not have prescription coverage for SOLIQUA 100/33 may pay as little as \$99 per pack.<sup>†</sup> Based on the cost of the drug, occurrences of greater than \$99 per pack co-pay will be rare. IL and LA have taxes that may impact the \$99 co-pay.

<sup>†</sup>This is \$99 per pack; if a patient requires 2 packs, they will pay \$198.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **I am a Medicare Part D patient. Is SOLIQUA 100/33 included in any Insulin Savings programs?**

The Inflation Reduction Act (Medicare Insulin Savings) caps the cost of insulin at a maximum \$35 per month, including in the donut hole, for patients who have Medicare Part D coverage. Patients no longer need to enroll in a program. GLP-1 RAs are not covered.

### **What if my prescription insurance changes once I am on SOLIQUA 100/33?**

Notify your pharmacy. In fact, when you take medications that require refills regularly over time, it's always good to periodically check that your pharmacy has your most up-to-date insurance information on file. This can help you avoid potential delays in getting your prescription.

### **What are the eligibility requirements for the SOLIQUA 100/33 Co-pay Card?**

The SOLIQUA 100/33 Savings Card program will offer co-pay savings for patients ages 18 and older and a resident of the United States, Puerto Rico, Guam, or the US Virgin Islands.

This offer is for commercially insured patients and is not valid for prescriptions covered by or submitted for reimbursement under Medicare, Medicaid, VA, DOD, TRICARE, or similar federal or state programs, including any state pharmaceutical programs. Void where prohibited by law. Savings Card carries maximum savings of \$365 per pack, up to 2 packs for each 30-day supply, for the duration of the program. Savings may vary depending on patient's out-of-pocket costs. Upon registration, patient receives all program details. Sanofi US reserves the right to rescind, revoke, or amend the program without notice.
